## Officer and coordinator positions per BCBC bylaws

#### **ARTICLE V: OFFICERS**

The officers of the club shall be four—president, vicepresident, treasurer, and secretary—and shall be elected in accordance with the stipulations of these bylaws. They are listed in order of authority for purposes of conducting club business.

President: shall be the chief administrator who shall call and preside at all meetings; shall schedule meetings; be an ex-officio member of all other committees; perform any and all such duties to effectuate the powers of the president in his absence;

Vice-President: shall preside at all meetings in the absence of the President perform any and all such powers to effectuate the powers of the president in his absence;

Secretary: shall establish, keep, and maintain a record (minutes) of all meetings; assume the responsibility of correspondence;

Treasurer: shall have custody of the club's funds and shall keep full and accurate accounts of receipts and disbursements in the books of the club. He/she shall keep the money of the club in accounts to the credit of the club and shall disburse the funds of the club as may be appropriate in accordance with the authority granted or as otherwise ordered by the executive committee.

#### ARTICLE VI: EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

The Executive Committee shall comprise the four elected officers in addition to any non-elected officers, also referred to as coordinators, listed in this article and standing or ad hoc committee chairs appointed pursuant to Article VII hereunder. The Executive Committee shall have the power to make the day-to-day decisions necessary to

committee to plan events and the direction for the club. It's fun to work with enthusiastic people and make things happen that benefit so many people.

The job requires good writing and editing skills, keeping a list of upcoming events and items to publish, planning ahead, reminding people about deadlines for information, and being familiar with a page layout program such as Microsoft Publisher. I have extensive instructions on using it, by the way, and will help out until the new editor is confident about handling it.

the efficient running of the club subject to the powers of the other committees set forth herein. The Executive Committee shall meet on a monthly basis as determined by the President or by agreement of a majority of the active members of the executive committee. The nonelected officers and their duties shall consist of the following:

Ride Coordinator: Shall schedule club rides; provide the schedule to the newsletter editor and webmaster for publication on a monthly basis;

Membership Coordinator: shall maintain a current list of all members, maintain a directory of members and endeavor to increase membership.

Newsletter Editor Coordinator: shall prepare, review, edit and compose the monthly newsletter on a timely basis to be distributed by the 25th of each month. He/she shall send complete ride list to webmaster.

Shoo-Fly Classic Coordinator: shall organize the annual Shoo-Fly Classic ride and oversee activities during the ride.

Webmaster Coordinator: shall maintain the structure and content of the club web site, and ensure that it is available (up). May delegate the maintenance of content to one or more individuals, as needed or appropriate.

Media Liaison & Public Relations Coordinator: shall serve as a liaison with news media and post items on social media as needed or as requested by the executive committee.

Racing Division Committee Chair: shall organize and oversee any activities related to bicycle racing activities.

## **BERKS COUNTY BICYCLE CLUB RIDES**

First Number: Terrain Rating Terrain rating 1-5 rates the total hilliness of the ride. 1 = FLAT–easiest

**2= GENTLY ROLLING HILLS**—moderate terrain with easiest of hills (Almost anyone can handle).

**3= SOME HILLS–***Moderate hills with* some steeper grades (Moderately Challenging–but within the ability of most riders).

**4= HILLY–***The number and difficulty of hills is quite substantial (Very Challenging).* 

**5= EXTREMELY HILLY**–*Extreme Challenge- steep and long hills most of the ride. Requires a very high fitness level).*  Second Number: Total Mileage for ride Please note the Club policy on protective headgear: ALL Riders must wear Snell/ANSI rated helmets. Ride Host/ Hostess will NOT give cue sheets to riders without helmets and that rider will not be considered an official participant of the Club ride.

Please have your bike in proper working order BEFORE the start of ride. Arrive 10-15 minutes before start time so that all rides leave on time. Bring a spare tube or patch kit, and at least one water bottle.

If weather conditions are questionable, the ride host may notify club members by post-

ing a message on **Facebook** prior to the ride or make a decision at the starting location based on road conditions and the forecast.

#### Berks County Bicycle Club Meeting Minutes Nov. 11, 2024, Bella Italia, Oley

Attendees: Kathleen Casner, Scott Franzen, Alan Fineman, Linda Gross, Gary Rollman, Félix Peña, Jane Brown

#### **Updates** President/Vice President:

Vice President Linda reported for Randy, asking opinion on the colors of the old jerseys that will be available to order. Everyone agreed that keeping the red, black and white would be best. Voted 7-0 to keep jersey the same.

**Treasurer:** Alan provided a detailed data report of expenses April-October 2024 with a comparison to October 2023. Current balance of accounts is \$9,691.96, and the balance is \$1098.22 less than October 2023. Alan will continue to provide a summary report each month.

**Membership:** Kat reports that she has been in touch with Pretzel City and they will continue to provide registration services for the club. BCBC currently has 183 individual club members.

**Newsletter:** Nothing new to report, Poncho reminded everyone December will be our first quarterly newsletter and we should plan accordingly.

Mileage Master: We currently are in need of ride hosts for certain locations: Adamstown, Maiden Creek Park, Wilson, Daniel Boone, North Temple, Wyomissing, Schulykill Valley, and Saucony Creek.

**Webmaster:** Scott has brought up the idea of the club purchasing a Ride With GPS club account.

**Discussion & Planning Items** Newsletter Changes: The current and most accurate ride schedule will continue to be on the BCBC website. Last-minute changes to rides (usually due to weather) will be posted on Facebook. In addition, there will be a supplemental email sent each month to members to include an updated two-month ride schedule.

**Rides and Ride Schedule:** We are continuing the discussion on the current state of our ride schedule and the rides. Gary expressed concerns with too many rides being



offered on the same dates and that this lessens the number of riders at each ride. Gary and Scott also expressed concerns with the length of rides; they felt there were too many long rides. We currently have three long rides (two Ramble Rides and one Adventure Ride) planned each month during favorable months. We also discussed hosting an "intro to group riding"; more on this next month.

Gary provided data regarding number of participants doing long rides. Fifteen riders did one or two long rides. We do not have similar numbers regarding shorter rides.

There was a long discussion as to what type of rides are preferred and that may grow membership. Responses included: rides are too long, rides are too fast, and variety of current rides is fine.

Alan again suggested we consider hosting a series of "intro to group riding rides." We have several people volunteering to help with this.

Gary also would like to see "stay together rides" and will provide more information regarding this.

The Executive Committee asks that members provide feedback as to what type ride they prefer, the distances, the locations, the pace, the schedule. This helps with planning the ride schedule and rides to the preference of our members.

**Elections reminder:** It is time to nominate people for BCBC officer positions. The election will take place Spring 2025. All elected positions are open at every election. These positions include president, vice president, treasurer, and secretary. Currently, Paul DeLong has been nominated as president, and Alan Fineman as treasurer. Please let one of the current members of the Executive Committee know if you wish to nominate somebody.

We also need to fill positions on the Executive Committee. These positions currently include ride coordinator, membership coordinator newsletter editor coordinator, Shoo-Fly coordinator, webmaster coordinator, and media liaison coordinator. Please let a current committee member know if you are willing and able to help your club!

**Spring Banquet;** Planning for the Spring Banquet has begun. Current target date is the weekend of March 28-30. Kathleen is contacting several locations. Help with the planning is always welcome!

**Next Meeting:** Monday December 9, 2024. All members are welcome! Topics: Elections, Rides and ride schedule, Spring Banquet.
